SUBJECT: Attendance at Executive Faculty Meeting

The principal issue at the Executive Faculty was the change in curriculum - increasing weeks for medicine in the third and fourth year and decreasing psychiatry and surgery. Dr. Jaffe indicated that psychiatry had accepted the decrease in a gentlemanly fashion. The surgical representatives voiced great concern that this recommendation would be disastrous to the surgery training program.

It was my impression that Dr. Jaffe's report was poorly described with inadequate support of the numbers in the proposal. He was unprepared and insisted that the report submitted (appended) had many errors in it.

On a vote to table, I abstained.

On a vote to accept the report, I voted against acceptance.

The ^{vote} was not accepted 13 to 12.
