Dear Dr. Kuhn,

The data of the GPA-1 Dopa study is still being analyzed. The EEG analyses are completed and these show some effects for 1-Dopa but more for GPA. The 1-Dopa effect is probably not significantly different from placebo.

The boys are now completing the behavioral data, and promise it by the end of the next week.

I am writing today to clarify some points about my next trip to Europe. I plan to be at the sleep EEG meetings in Würzburg, and had hoped to arrange to visit Ingelheim with you, *should this type of visit be useful to you in discussing EEG analyses with your co-workers.* Earlier this week, Dr. Terry called to say that attempts were being made for me to visit Munich and to hold some conferences in other laboratories. While such visits are most enlightening and occasionally useful, I do not have the time to go on the lecture trail during this trip. It is necessary that I spend as much time as possible in Athens and Amsterdam to carry out my own work in these cities.

For this reason, and since I have not heard directly from you, I am planning to go from Würzburg to Athens. In the event that a visit to Ingelheim would be potentially useful to you and to my laboratory, I shall be pleased to arrange a visit on another trip, as I plan to be in Europe on a few occasions during the next six months (until my work in Athens is completed).

I will send the data and the analyses as soon as the boys have completed the work.
