Dr. Akira Yuki take of Fukuoka has requested an appointment in this Department as a Research Fellow. We have reviewed his curriculum vitae with interest, and are writing to obtain further information regarding his professional experience and abilities.

However, we are now in the process of developing animal neurophysiological research laboratories, with specific emphasis on the effects of psychotropic compounds on brain function in dogs and other small animals.

We would be particularly interested in any comments you would like to make regarding Dr. Yuki take's ability to carry out independent research in clinical or experimental neurophysiology; his ability to participate in collaborative research programs; and specifically, his technical ability in neurophysiological research with dogs or cats. We are particularly interested in the problem of implanted electrodes in chronic preparations.
