Dear Professor Zubek:

I had the pleasure of hearing Dr. Mike Saunders present some of the EEG findings in your perceptual isolation study program at the recent meetings in Salzburg and Vienna. His presentation was stimulating for it confirmed many of the suggestions made some years ago regarding the physiological basis for the persistence of behavioral changes in individuals subjected to the perceptual isolation procedure.

When I inquired of Dr. Saunders whether these findings had been published, he indicated that much of the material is now being prepared. I will be grateful for any preprints which you may have available regarding the electrographic changes and behavioral changes occurring in your study program. One of my associates in these laboratories is now interested in embarking on a study comparing the electrographic changes in perceptual isolation in psychotic subjects and comparing the persistence of these patterns to dosages of various anticholinergic drugs.
