Dear Miss Hayhurst:

Thank you for your letter of inquiry regarding a position in psychopharmacology in these laboratories. I have made the inquiries of other staff members who are responsible for the animal study programs. I regret to say that funds are apparently not available for the appointment of any new positions during the next few months.

Since I cannot tell whether your comments regarding your interest in this laboratory are related to its location (in St. Louis) or to its emphasis on psychopharmacology, I would like to tell you that the program for which I have been responsible will probably be curtailed during 1966, insofar as I have accepted the position as Professor of Psychiatry at the New York Medical College in June. I look forward to establishing similar studies there, and I know that the present laboratory director, Dr. E. Roy John, has excellent facilities and I believe that he might be interested in personnel with your qualifications.
