Dear Dr. Holden:

I should like to do my best to reassure you regarding your credentials. As I understand the record, you qualify for this position, lacking only the full ECFMG certificate. With that qualification, you are eligible for the position of Senior Research Scientist at the Institute, and that appointment will be effective on the date that you have satisfactorily completed the ECFMG examination.

To support that application, it would be helpful to have a copy of the D.P.M. certificate. I have not asked for that because I do not think it is necessary until the ECFMG qualification has been satisfied. I will urge you, however, to bring your original certificate with you.

In my original letter, I indicated that housing is available because the hospital is located in the heart of the city. One of the new staff members, Dr. Donald Sundland, has rented a home about twelve minutes from the hospital. Dr. Itil has found a very fine home for rent as half of a two-family house. Dr. Gershon has rented an apartment at some distance from the hospital, but has done so largely to be close to a parochial school which his children attend. Dr. Neubauer has written to you about his accommodations.

If you are planning to come before your family, we will try to set aside some space within the hospital for your accommodation during the time that you try to find accommodations in the community. Unfortunately, there are no apartments at the hospital which would satisfy your family's requirements.

I believe that Mrs. Neubauer would be able to make inquiries in the community, if you desire these to be made before you come.

I look forward to working closely with a Lancastrian, for I cannot recall ever having had that pleasure before.
