Dear Alan,

I returned to New York Saturday evening-- tired but most enthusiastic with the progress of your units. I am confident that the center in London will develop nicely under Leo Lange, and am scheduling a study of GB-94 to begin in April.

Yesterday, I discussed the potential studies of GB-94 and OI-63 with Dr. Joyce Small: I found her interested in both studies and I believe she will write to Hank shortly, to indicate that she can begin the study of GB-94 as soon as all the papers are approved; and of OI-63, when she has developed some tests of memory loss after a single seizure. This latter problem is more difficult, and will take some time to unravel.
