Dear Dr. Rosenberg:

Before receiving your last letter I, too, had contacted the Immigration Authorities in the United States. When I was told that even the first preference visa there was a delay of eighteen months, I set into motion a number of political maneuvers which make me believe that we should be able to reduce this delay to a period of three-five months. As you know, this Institute is supported by the State of Missouri, and as one of fifty sovereign states has selfishly guarded its privileges when its welfare was questioned. As we have been successful on earlier occasions, I would be optimistic that our present maneuvers may also be successful.

With this in mind, may I have your recommendation again? I will withdraw these letters if these facts do not alter your decision.
