Dear Mr. Goldman:

I am grateful for the opportunity to discuss our projects with you. In reviewing our present program, I do not believe we can undertake a study of ethaverine during the next four months.

We will attempt to establish a laboratory for quantitative electroencephalography in New York early this summer. As soon as a project is feasible, I will write to you and if your interest is still sustained, I will be glad to undertake such a study.

The analysis of the EEG effects of ethaverine required seven records. Of these, two were with single doses and five with the double dose. Four additional records with two capsules were undertaken with changing behavioral conditions, and while they are consistent with the definitive records, they are superfluous for your needs.
