Dear Dr. Rice:

Dr. John A. Stern has sent me a copy of your curriculum vitae, with the suggestion that we may have an opportunity for an associate with your qualifications.

At the present time, our research program is expanding rapidly. We have just appointed a young neurophysiologist, who is interested in developing a program on the effect of psychopharmacological agents on invoked potentials, both in man and animals.

We have just made another appointment, of a pharmacologist with extensive experience in cardio-vascular conditioning, who has become interested in testing CNS agents to learn more about the interaction of brain function and motor behavior.

This institute has an active program in the analysis of EEG-behavioral relations in man. We have set up a computer center in association with the EEG laboratory. At the present time we are studying the effects of drugs on both EEG and behavior, with both acute and chronic administration. In the course of this work we have become excited by the possibility of applying techniques like continuous performance task measurements and reaction time with concurrent EEG measurement.

In the latter program, we have an opening available for an experimentally oriented physiological psychologist. From your record, I find that you have had limited experience with human material, and yet there is sufficient acquaintance to warrant further consideration. I am taking the liberty of enclosing a copy of our recent annual report, as this will describe the Institute in considerable detail. If the opportunity to work in this program is of interest to you, I would like to hear from you further.
