Dear Doctor Cotzias,

I very much enjoyed our discussion last week. I went back to my files and sought my notes on the structure of anticholinergic drugs. At that time I was impressed that two roots seemed to be present for hallucinogenic activity (described below). In looking over these notes today, I believe that compounds with other structuring also show anticholinergic activity and that these notes are incomplete.

I am enclosing some of the reprints on ECT and my experience with anticholinergics for your information.
