Dear Dick:

As you know, since the discussions at UCLA in 1960 on EEG and computers, I have tried to establish a laboratory using computer methods. Here in Missouri I have been successful and for the past few months we have been able to study the effects of some drugs on the scalp recorded electroencephalogram. We are using a 1620-1710 system and the first program was modification of Neil Burch's period analysis.

I have the opportunity to visit Los Angeles on September 11-12. The IBM representative has agreed to take me through the computer facility at UCLA the morning of the 12th. If it is not too much of an imposition, would it be possible for me to spend about an hour with you to see and learn something about your methods on the afternoon of the 12th?

You may be interested in a session on methods of measuring EEG changes which a study group of the ACNP is planning to hold on Sunday, October 6th, in the evening just prior to the EEG meetings. If you plan to be at the Jack Tar Hotel, we would be pleased if you would be able to join us that evening.
