Dear Bernie:

You requested that I summarize our study programs in a single page. The best summary is the one that I have recently prepared for presentation at the World Congress of Psychiatry. A copy is enclosed for your use.

I have proceeded with the application to the NIMH in the hope that we will be able to have adequate time set aside for studies proposed. I indicated the sense of our discussions to Dr. Freedman and trust that this will be resolved at the next meeting of the Computer Committee.

I have also called Mr. Shearman, and was reassured by him that the 1710 might be available at the time we need it. He has indicated that he would like a letter from the College so that he could place the necessary orders, especially for the 1443 printer. I have written to Dr. Freedman asking that he make the necessary arrangements with the authorities at the College, including yourself, so that the order for the 1710 and the 1443 could be entered now (subject, of course, to later cancellation if the grant is not approved). A copy of my note to him is enclosed for your information.

I will not be at the College this week, but may be in again at the end of the next. I will take the opportunity to call you and to determine present status of our applications.
