Dear Dr. Gardos,

Enclosed is the summary report of the EEG data analyses of the high and low dose thiothixene studies completed recently. While there were some technical difficulties, there was sufficient material to elicit drug-EEG effects in the long-term treatment condition. The short-term effects were less clear, probably as a result of the small sample.

The decrease in mean frequency and in mean frequency variability measures with chronic thiothixene administration is consistent with our earlier studies of the effects of thiothixene, and with the classification proposed in our earlier publications (*Ann. Rev. Pharmacol.* 9:241-258, 1969).
