Dear Dr. Remarque:

I am writing with regard to Supplement 23 to the *EEG Journal*, "A Selected Bibliography of Electroencephalography in Human Psychopharmacology." I do not know if you are pleased with its reception, but I have received a reasonable number of inquiries and these have pleased me. I am writing today to request your assistance in a very simple problem.

Elsevier is continuing to advertise this volume. While I know that it was published when the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry was part of the St. Louis State Hospital, I do not think that this is the proper designation for that publication. In September, 1965 I wrote to request your consideration of a change in the designation for advertising purposes, and I am writing again for the second time.

Since leaving Missouri, I have taken on the position of Professor of Psychiatry at the New York Medical College. I would be pleased if it were possible for the advertisements to identify me in my present position as Professor of Psychiatry.

If you believe that it is not proper to change the advertisement to my present status, would you please honor my original request so that the listings would use a designation "Professor of Psychiatry, Department of Psychiatry at the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry, University of Missouri School of Medicine, St. Louis, Missouri."

As I wrote in September 1965, if there are any charges to be incurred by such redesignation, I would be willing to defray them. Please honor this request. As you may know, identification with

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state hospitals is not the highest designation for scientific work. It does not enhance the reception of this bibliography for readers to believe that it was done at a state hospital in the United States. Perhaps, its reception from your point of view as well as my own, would be benefited by the clearer and more distinct designation that this was accomplished at a university facility.

Thank you very much for your cooperation.
