Dear Dr. Morrow:

Thank you for your letter and application. I have discussed these with Dr. Kohler and am pleased to recommend your appointment as a career resident in psychiatry for a two year course of study. The initial appointment is at the level of 4th year training, at an annual stipend of \$12,000.

It is our recommendation that you participate in the basic psychiatric program, including experience in general clinical psychiatry, admission unit, and the acute treatment center in the first year; and, OPD psychotherapy, inpatient therapies and consultations in the second. Throughout this period, we would encourage you to participate in the training seminars at the Institute and at the local universities. In this program you will be supervised by Dr. A. Ferro.

Rather than take part as a student in the neurology training programs, we would be pleased to have you participate as an instructor; and to the extent that your time permits, continue your clinical experience in clinical neurology and clinical electroencephalography at the hospital. In these you will be supervised by Dr. Itil and myself. We are now planning a three year neurology program, and hope to have your help in the seminars and lectures.

To the extent that your training program permits, we would be pleased to have you participate in the research projects now being structured at the Institute. It is our intention to establish a neurology service for research and for training, and your collaboration in that venture will be expected.

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At the outset, your primary emphasis must be in the training programs, and it would not be expected that neurological services be provided other institutions of the division. As soon as you have fulfilled your requirements for the psychiatric examination, your re-appointment at a staff level in neurology and/or research at a significantly higher stipend should be a formality.

I trust these notes are sufficiently clear and look forward to having you join our program. My best regards.
