Thank you very much for your letter of December 10, requesting an appointment in research in psychopharmacology or clinical EEG. I note that your letter was sent to the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry. I left the Institute in June and am now re-establishing my laboratories in New York. I am interested in appointing candidates for research positions and the facilities at this new Center later in 1967 will be the equivalent of those in St. Louis.

If you are especially desirous of working in St. Louis, I will be pleased to send your letter on to my associates who have continued the research programs at the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry.

If you are willing to consider an appointment in New York, I would be pleased if you would send me the names of three of your associates to whom I may write for letters of reference.
