Dear Dean:

I was so excited to receive your call yesterday that I neglected to ask you what the difference of EEG patterns was. When you called, I was in the midst of discussing what I had learned about canonical correlation with Jim Vanderplas. When I told Dr. Itil about the finding, he said that was obvious, and indicated that the pattern would be more beta-2, less alpha and more delta in the schizophrenics with more alpha in the depressives. Is that so?

I am delighted that you will be at the ACNP. You should know that our study group is planning a two-day discussion of digital techniques in EEG analysis. We have invited Don Walter of U.C.L.A. to present some of the theoretical models now in use at BRI. In addition to the usual ACNP members, E. Roy John, John Stern and Frank Ervin will also be there.
