We have reviewed the request by Mr. Gamage for the submission of an original report for the new journal, PHANTASTICA, and ^{are} ~~are~~ pleased that my associates agree to send you such a report within the next few months. The report will detail the central nervous system effects of a variety of hallucinogens, and will summarize the data presented in a review article I wrote last year entitled, 'Neurophysiology of Phantastica- EEG and Behavioral Relations in Man'.
