Dear Ed,

We have reviewed the two case records of the ketipramine-imipramine study and can resolve the apparent discrepancies.

Frieda Ehrenberg. Patient was unreliable in attending the clinic. On March 3 she received active medication and an appointment for March 10. She returned 1/2 box of medication on March 11, indicating she had stopped medication earlier, estimated as 3/6. She was referred for group therapy. Her follow-up laboratory test on 3/17 was evaluated as on no active medication.

Millie Mauer. On 2/17/69 she received ketipramine. She had no medication from 2/10 to 2/17 due to a missed appointment on 2/10. The laboratory tests were done before the new supply was given. Since she had no medication for one week, test was adjudged as on "no medication".

I trust this data is useful.
