Dear Mr. Serchuck:

Both Al Freedman and I thank you for your prompt reply and favorable consideration of our request to continue supplies of naloxone for clinical trial in the treatment of opiate dependence.

The proposed supply of 6 kilograms of naloxone, 3 kilograms by November 1, 1970 and 1 1/2 kilograms each by December 1, 1970 and January 1, 1971 is satisfactory and will permit us to undertake our present clinical assay.

We have discussed with Dr. Jacobsen the formulation of naloxone and he has assured us of his cooperation in providing the supplies in either tablets or liquid vehicle, as most feasible for the study.

On behalf of the College and the New York State Narcotic Addiction Control Commission we are indeed grateful that you are considering supplying this at no direct cost to the people of the State of New York.

My personal thanks for your cooperation and sincere efforts on behalf of this program.
