Dear Mr. Lindquist:

It was a pleasure talking with you this morning about the opportunities for research assistants at this laboratory. I am taking the liberty of enclosing a description of this laboratory written October, 1962.

We now have laboratories operational in neurophysiology and pharmacology, and expect the biochemistry laboratory to be running this fall. In neurophysiology the studies are in the relation of EEG signals to new drugs. In pharmacology, various new chemicals are being tested in both animals and man.

The principal types of work are in recording bioelectric phenomena in patients and in animals using high gain amplifiers, tape recorders, transducers, etc.

Full time assistants are preferred but we make adjustments for six to ten hours of classes. The working hours can be arranged provided that the major portion is during the work day of the senior scientist.
