Dear Philip:

I now know that I should have held up my letter to you, for in this morning's mail, I received the enclosed communication from Dr. Vojtechovsky. I had spent a few hours with him in Salzburg and Vienna and asked him to recommend the names of workers who may be interested in our symposium. The Russian names that I sent to you earlier this week came from that discussion. He reinforces his comments in the present letter, a copy of which is enclosed.

I think that both Dr. Votava and Dr. Vojtechovsky should be considered. If it seems advisable to have another representative, Dr. Bohdanecky might be invited.

I have already suggested Dr. M. J. Michelson and Dr. Denisenko and perhaps we should consider Dr. Ilyutchenok as well.

It seems that there are a goodly number of people working in this area and the opportunities for invitations seem much better than we felt in London. Let me hear from you soon.
