I was pleased to receive your letters concerning Drs. Don and Lantin. I had already received a very excellent letter from Dr. Hurst concerning Dr. Don, and have just offered him a position at the Institute. Many thanks.

Dr. Lantin's hesitancy in joining the hospital staff appears to be considerable, and I have followed your note with a letter of my own, indicating the extent to which this community does have a large Jewish population, and the integration of the Jews in the community.

I would like to call on you once again in that I have just received application from Dr. George Shaw, whom you may already know since he was registrar at the Maudsley from 1956 to 1959. A copy of his c.v. is enclosed, and I have taken the liberty of writing to him, suggesting that he call you.

I have, within the last week, received an invitation from the CINP program committee, to participate actively in the 1964 Birmingham meetings. I accepted gladly, and now look forward to being in Europe during most of August and part of September. For this reason, George and I feel that it would be unwise for me to travel now. I have urged him to join me on this trip and I think it may be possible that both he and Turan Itil, as well as myself, will be in Birmingham during the first week in September.

I would be most pleased to have an opportunity to visit with you either before or after that meeting. As our plans are now being developed, Martha hopes to join me for part of that time and, with some good fortune in our finances during the next few months, I hope to be able to visit Israel as part of our holiday.
