Dear Mrs. Allyn:

This is to confirm our telephone conversation of this morning.

On our trip to Moscow, we would like to visit Leningrad as well. In checking some of the flight schedules, it becomes difficult to participate in a 21 day schedule and still go New York-Leningrad-Moscow. However, it is possible to do this leaving on August 1 and spending 2-3 days in Leningrad; this would be ideal.

Lacking that, we would prefer going directly New York-Moscow with a one day stopover in Paris. If we were to take the night flight from New York to Paris, we would spend the next day and evening in Paris, and leave for Moscow the next morning.

On our trip to Moscow-Leningrad, we would like to take the Red Arrow Express night train to Leningrad.

The most difficult problem is leaving Russia to fly to Istanbul. We would be grateful for your recommendations regarding the best days and routes. You indicate that Belgrade is probably the easiest, and if this is so, perhaps we should spend one day visiting that city.

The trip from Istanbul to New York is to be left open for the time being. If arrangements are made New York to Leningrad directly, then we wish reservations Paris to New York by Pan American for the end of the 21 day period. If we have already spent a day in Paris on the way to Moscow, then the return reservation should be Rome-New York.

We would prefer American carriers transatlantic.
