Voita has shared with me his experiences at the EEG meetings earlier this month. He was very much impressed with the quality of work now in progress in Europe, but particularly with that which you and your coworker Dr. Matejcek are carrying out. As you know, I have continued to apply our period and power spectral analysis and the complex statistics designed by Don Shapiro to the problem of defining drug effects. Voita believes that your methods make a positive contribution to drug classification, and I am interested in visiting with you on one of my forthcoming trips to Europe.

I plan to be in Europe for the EEG meetings in Marseilles, and should you be back in your laboratories right after the meeting, perhaps I could arrange a visit then. Alternatively, I expect to be in Europe again about October 25-27th, and I could visit you before or after.

Finally, should you have any reports written by yourself or Dr. Matejcek I would appreciate copies, particularly of the report just presented which so impressed Voita.

I have moved my laboratory sixty miles east of New York City, to the farmlands and the country. This week I have bought a second house which overlooks the water. It is much smaller than the one you visited, but it has a special advantage of being less than ten minutes

He has become particularly interested in the geology of the desert. As a sideline, he has learned to fly, and Martha and I are both pleased with his progress and plans.
