Dear Dr. Nakamura:

Your letter to Dr. George Ulett was referred to me for a reply. Dr. Ulett is now the Chairman of the new Department of Psychiatry at the Missouri Institute of Psychiatry of the University of Missouri School of Medicine.

In reading your letter, I find that you have some experience not only with clinical neurophysiology but animal work as well. At the present time, we are considering establishing an additional laboratory for the study of brain wave changes in implant electrodes in dogs. In this position, we are seeking somebody with neurophysiological experience with animals who can implant electrodes, prepare the proper recordings and make the necessary analysis so as to provide a comparison for the effects of drugs in dogs as well as man. We are studying a variety of psychotropic drugs in this study program.

Before writing to your references, I would like your opinion regarding such an opportunity in experimental neurophysiology in our animal laboratory. If this position interests you and if you have experience in such work, I would be pleased to hear from you and then write to Drs. Miura, Makita and Hara.
