Dear Dr. Heinemann:

I must apologize for this tardy reply to your interesting letter and your reprints. Since our report in Madrid, we have written a number of others describing our EEG programs and I am enclosing reprints of these as they have recently been published.

The examples given are quite simple and do not do justice to the power of the analysis system. As you indicate, there is a need for greater communication among the few workers interested in this type of analysis. The programs which we use, those of period, power spectral density, and amplitude analyses are available now for the IBM 1800. This program is readily adaptable for the IBM 360 and should be easily useable in the Control Data series of instruments. If you have a programmer who is interested in obtaining a copy of the print-out, we will supply one.

In this country, the best work of the kind that seems to interest you is undertaken by Drs. Mirsky and Cornetzky, both at the Division of Psychiatry, Boston University School of Medicine, Boston, Massachusetts.
