Apparently our letters have passed each other in the mail. The Form DSP-66 was sent to you for completion and I believe your copy is to be filed with the Consulate General in Canada. If that is not true, please write again and we will try to make another copy here for your use.

Regarding accommodations at the hospital, the Superintendent generally has apartments available on a temporary basis. He has been kind enough to make these available to other staff men coming here. He will make them available to us if they are not in use. If you will let me know whether you are bringing your family with you (how many children), and your estimated date of arrival, I should let you know if accommodations can be made available.

It would be difficult to outline in detail the kind of work that you would participate in, but I think you will find that there are a variety of programs in operation and you should have an opportunity to expand your experience both in psychiatry and electroencephalography. I would rather go over the details with you once you are here.
