Enclosed are two copies of the hysteria paper, and the earlier drafts which were in my files. In general, I find this draft quite readable and believe if we make the necessary corrections in English and style and add the references and retype it, that it can probably go out.

In my original notes, I was concerned about our justification for our diagnosis of schizophrenia in Case 3. I have, therefore, tried to recall what he was like and have added two sentences on page 18, beginning with "Psychiatric examinations disclosed..." and ending with "...moods were noted". If you have the original records, please rewrite this section, or at least edit it carefully to prevent me from confabulating and distorting and manifesting a concreteness, which may be the hallmark of my present age.
