Dear Stan:

Don has successfully run the TTR analyses of the cards which you have sent to us. The analyses were run on the local IBM 360. I am taking the liberty of sending you a copy of a number of the output sheets, and would be grateful if you would scan them to see if they appear logical to you.

The EEG analyses for those records that we have and the pupillary data are available. Don and I discussed the next step, and we would like to invite you to come as soon as the remaining records have been analyzed. We would then like to set aside some time at the unit here, and we can do both the analyses of the TTR data for the new transcriptions and then any of the statistical analyses that seem appropriate for the comparison of language and EEG changes.

Dr. Miller at the University has requested permission to copy the cards and will, after introducing some punctuation, analyze the records according to the general inquirer program.

So, I think the next step is up to you. I will be away during the last week of March, but will be here during most of April and part of May.

We also have copies of your programs, including one that says "our only copy." I shall hold it for you if you wish it.
