Dear Dr. Kuhn:

We look forward to your visit in New York this spring. Dr. Terry will make the necessary arrangements for your stay, and I am writing to raise a few questions so that we can provide the facilities most useful to your visit, and establish a relationship which may be most useful.

In our laboratories, we are now carrying out EEG classification studies of new drugs in volunteers; assays of marijuana, both acute and chronic; and reviewing data from earlier studies of marijuana, ECT, methadone, etc. You may wish to observe our recording and analytic work; to participate in or undertake an on-going study; and/or analyze the data of one of the projects.

You also may wish to familiarize yourself with the analytic programs - the computer analyses, statistical processing and drug classification, either of an ongoing study, or a completed one.

If you wish, we can also arrange for someone to review your actual program needs, assuming you wished to do some processing of EEG data in your laboratories.

With these facilities in mind, would you provide us with the questions which you wish answered; or the goals of your visit. Am I correct to assume that you are interested in establishing a collaborative or a consulting relationship, both for studies in animals and man, toward identifying and developing new psychoactive drugs?

If these questions are indeed the focus of your visit, it would be helpful if you would send us or bring descriptions of the principal items of equipment now in your laboratories, particularly the EEG

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amplifiers (make, year, capacity for tape recording), tape recorders (make, model, speeds, tape size), and computers (make, model, peripherals, size of memory).

Again, I look forward to your visit, and to developing a productive relationship.
