Dear Dr. Khoo:

The training programs in postgraduate medicine in this Department are limited to training in psychiatry. I am taking the liberty, therefore, of sending your letter to the Chairman of the training committee, Dr. Ivan Sletten, with the request that he write to you describing our training program. If training in the United States in psychiatry is of interest to you, then I would suggest that you make an application to this program, for I think it is one of the best in the training of foreign physicians.

If, however, you would prefer to obtain postgraduate training in other branches of medicine, it would be helpful for you to write directly to the Dean of the School of Medicine of the University of Missouri.
