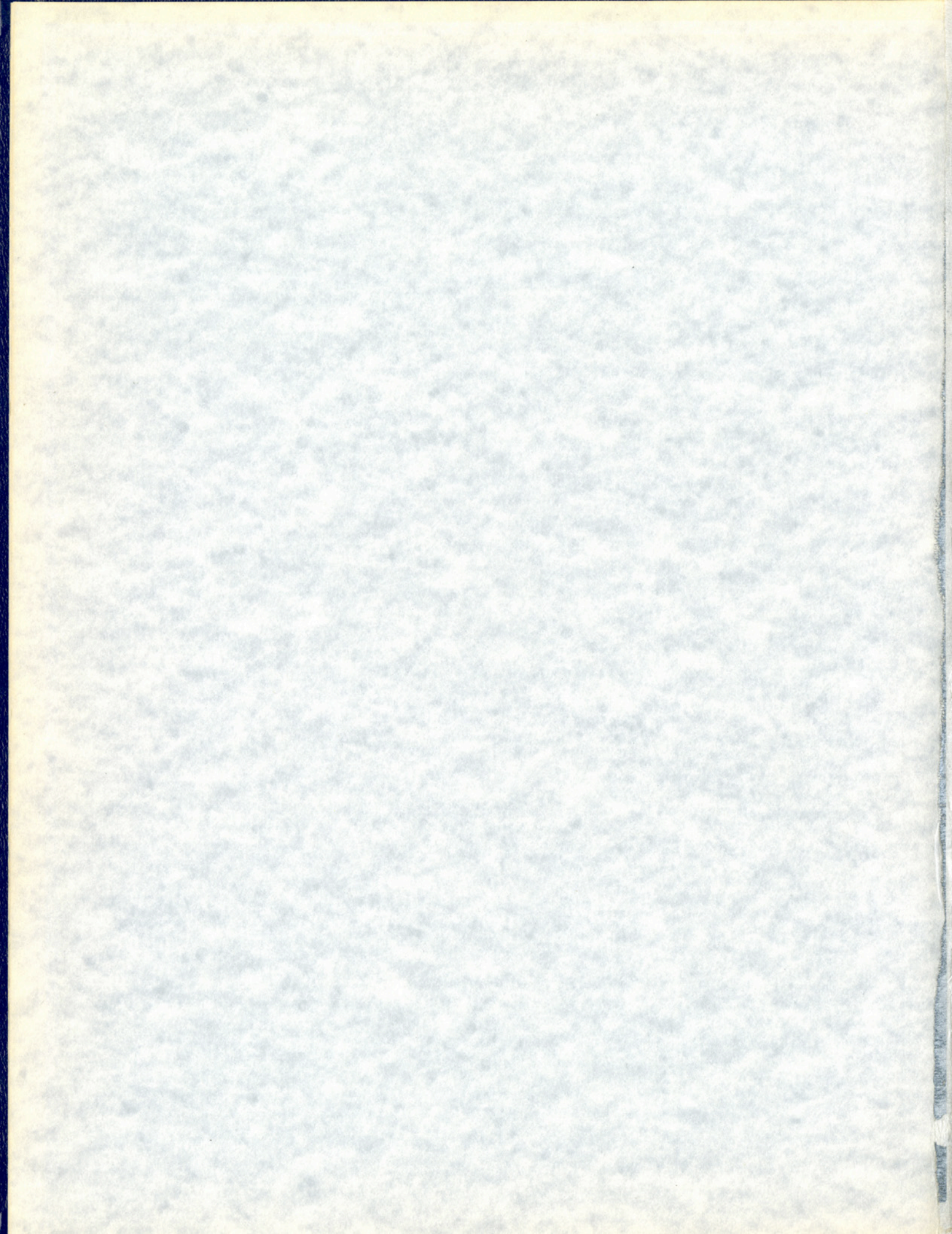

You for your AMCAS Application to the School of Medicine. This application material is the initial stage application process used at the School of Medicine. The material which you have submitted to us has been carefully reviewed by the Committee on Admissions.

Because of an increasingly large number of Maryland applicants, presenting very strong credentials, the number of places available in the first year class of the School of Medicine is limited. Consequently, the Committee on Admissions is unable to offer a place to all applicants who must present exceptionally strong credentials.

With sincere and deep regret that I must decline your application to the School of Medicine on Admissions, in light of your non-resident status, is unable to offer you a place in the class entering in the fall of 1978.

We are being informed of this decision as early as possible so that you can have the opportunity to apply to other schools.

At a recent meeting of the Committee on Admissions your application was carefully reviewed. In this review your Georgetown University Medical College Admission Test scores and the AMCAS and Supplemental Applications were carefully evaluated. Furthermore, letters of recommendation and personal letters of reference were evaluated. After a thorough and in-depth evaluation, the Committee on Admissions is unable to offer you an interview and, therefore, cannot offer you a place in the class entering in the fall of 1978.

The number of applicants for admission to the School of Medicine and Health Sciences exceeds the number of places available in the first year class of the School of Medicine.

"The prostatic utricle is really — now, catch this ladies and see why I haven't gotten any petitions — is the femologue, **not** the homologue, the femologue of a combination uterus and vagina."

"The male copulatory organ is described as having a dorsum and a ventrum. In the very male world of the 14-15 century, when these structures were being named, the dorsum and ventrum were described with the organ in a state of erection; which means that the anatomists were having a better time then, than we do now, and were in a constant state of excitement about their art."

"The erectile tissues consist of nothing more, nor less than, very, very large blood filled spaces — well, very, very large spaces which can or cannot be filled with blood. Sometimes they are and sometimes they're not."

"Without erection copulation simply won't occur, or it would be very difficult."

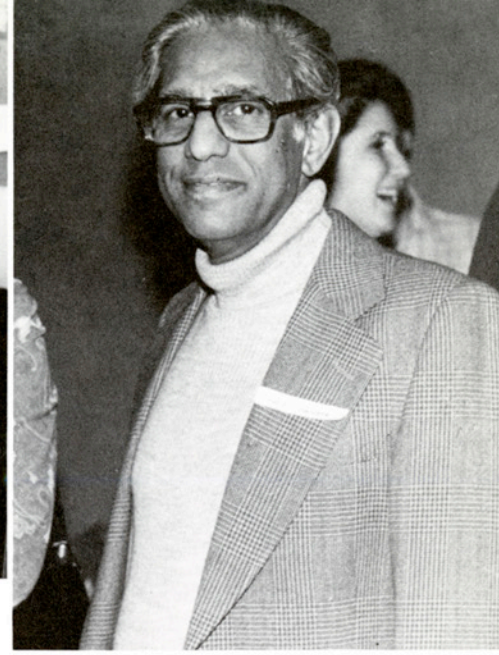
