Q1. How many people are in your house?

A1. 3 sons of which 2 are married. 3 daughters of which 2 are married

Q2. Are they educated?

A2. [Of the 3 sons, one has studied upto 7th grade, the other two upto 4th and 5th grade respectively. The daughters have studied upto 9th, 5th and 7th grade respectively.]

Q3. How do you sustain?

A3. Labour work. We don't have water availability so we have to do labour work.

[Someone said from behind that Babhri community have expertise in growing vegetables from seedling, cutting, storing and selling in the market. This is before water scarcity happened.]

Q4. Where do you work?

A4. When someone that has borewell calls us. If we get work, we eat otherwise we sit at home.

[They generally used to find sufficient work in the village but due to floods that came two years ago, the crops got destroyed and last year due to rainfall shortage the crops got destroyed.]

Q5. Do you fight over financial issues?

A5. We don't fight. If we don't have money, we don't eat. If we have little, we share. We all work together and try to make ends meet. [Mother in law and father in law died so they(husband and wife) have to make all the major decisions.]

Q6. Do you commute for work?

A6. NO we work in the village

Q7. Who looks after the children?

A7. We take them along.

Q7. How do you purchase the ration?

A7. We purchase it on credit. We pay it later by earnings we make during harvest season.
