We've been studying Gross Anatomy for 2 straight hours on a freezing and snowy day. However, we are still confused and overwhelmed. Help!

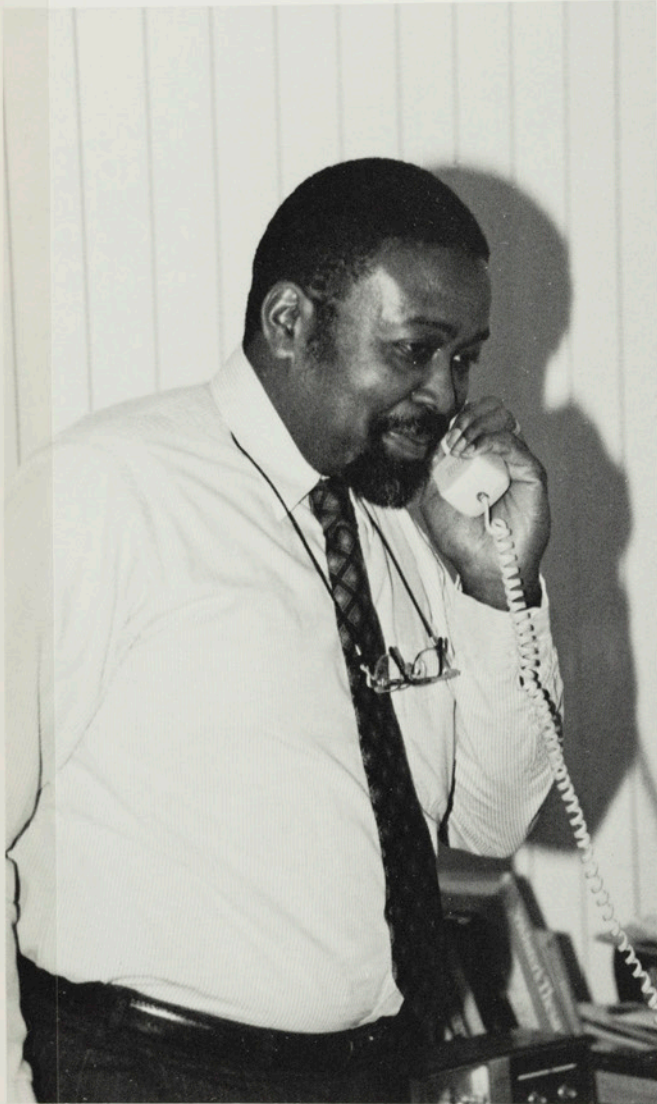
